- EPIRB registration papers MUST always be carried on the boat, and
- the white anchor light should always be ON after dark - even when moving not only when at anchor.
- ALWAYS carry your boat licences when out on the water. If caught without your licence, you may be issued a warning the first time and a second time could result in a \$250.00 fine on the spot.
